European Meetings - May 2007

He is expected to provide a presentation entitled "Renewables to Hydrogen", during the "*Setting the Scene*" opening session on 23 May. The exhibition is the United Kingdom's largest event devoted to renewable energy.

"**One Big Thing**" meeting in **Stockholm, Sweden**, which will be held 21-22 May 2007, and will focus on U.S.-Swedish cooperation in alternative energy. Mr. Serfass will also attend a meeting in **London** from 25-26 May representing PATH and the National Hydrogen Association.
